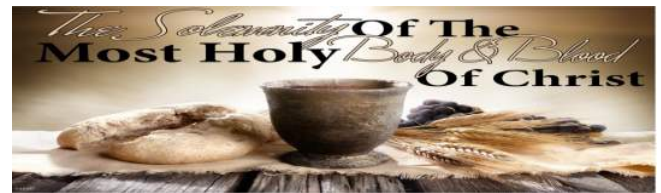

## INTRODUCING...

I am Rev. Chijioke John Nwankwo born into the family of Late Mr. Bartholomew Ikechukwu Nwankwo and Mrs Angelina Elegachi Nwankwo on 2nd of March, 1987 in the town of Umuchukwu, Orumba South Local Government Area, Anambra State, Nigeria. I have 4 siblings: 3 brothers and a sister. I was ordained a Catholic Priest on the 15th of July, 2017 by Most Rev. Paulinus Ezeokafor.

I did my philosophical studies in the centenary seminary, Bigard Memorial Seminary, Enugu and my theological studies in Blessed Tansi Major Seminary, Onitsha. It is worthy to mention the role of foreign missionaries and The Society of Saint Peter the Apostle (POSPA) played in building and sustaining this seminary. There is a missionary link between the two seminaries: Blessed Iwene Tansi, the first Nigerian to be beatified, was an alumnus of Bigard and the fact of naming a major seminary after him witnesses the fruit of the early missionaries in my country.

After my priestly ordination, I worked in different parishes as parish vicar. I also worked in two hospitals, Regina Caeli Awka and St. Raphael Hospital and maternity, Igboukwu. Finally, I served as a parish priest in a rural community in Ufuma. These pastoral experiences have really formed me in a positive way towards realizing my vocation and mission as a Catholic Priest.

Nigeria is located in West Africa, a Federal Republic with its capital in Abuja with a population of over 220 million people. It features a diverse landscape, a booming cultural and entertainment industry and a globally significant economy. Nigeria is officially divided into six geopolitical zones. Created in 1996 to promote equitable power-sharing and regional development, these zones group the 36 states and the Federal Capital Territory (FCT) based on shared cultural, historical and geographic Characteristics. The zones are; North-West, North-East, North-Central, South-West, South-East and South-South zones.

I come from South-Eastern Nigeria comprising Abia, Anambra, Ebonyi, Enugu and Imo states. Known as the traditional homeland of the Igbo people, the region is a major hub for commerce, agriculture and culture.

Catholicism in southeastern Nigeria (Igboland) emerged in 1885 with the arrival of French Holy Ghost (Spiritan) missionaries in Onitsha. Thanks to missionaries like Fr. Joseph Lutz, Bishop Joseph Shanahan, Archbishop Charles Hereey, Fr. Bubendorff, etc. Today, the fruits of this historical evangelization have turned Nigeria into a major missionary force. Due to the abundant number of vocations, priests and religious from southeastern Nigeria serve dioceses across the globe, supplementing shortages in countries lacking in priests. We have 277 priests in my diocese and over 46 of them working in the United States of America.

A priest is not his own. He is a collaborator of the bishop. My mission in this diocese was necessitated by the request of Bishop Lawrence Persico to my Bishop, Peter Ebere cardinal Okpaleke for missionaries. I joyfully accepted my bishop's request to go for mission in the United States, particularly in your diocese because his voice and mandate is that of God and of the Holy Spirit.

Matter-of-factly, this summarizes the feast of the Holy Trinity which we celebrate this weekend. The priest, being sent on a mission, fulfils this trinitarian mandate. The priest's physical journey mirrors the eternal procession within God. The priest imitates Christ, the "eternal Son" sent by the Father to redeem the world. The priest relies on the Holy Spirit, who is sent to empower and guide the work of the church and he is mandated to baptize in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, mystically linking the missionary act to the Triune identity.

As we have ended the Easter tide to begin the ordinary time of the church, the church posits the trinitarian communion as a model for all Christians. And may God bless us as we live out our Christian faith in the world and come to behold him in the beatific vision through Christ our Lord. Amen. Thanks for your understanding and hospitality so far.

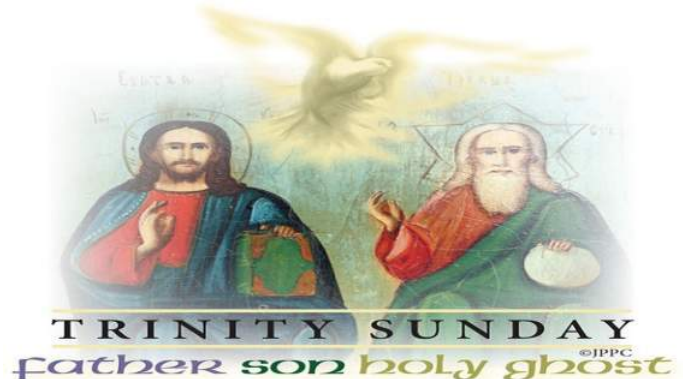
