## A Word from Father Brandon

After seven weeks, we have come to the end of our Easter Season and close out this long arc of a season, which began with Ash Wednesday some 90 days ago, and that saw us through the entirety of our Salvation! It always amazes me how, admittedly, overwhelming it feels on the eve of Ash Wednesday that there is so much to get through and handle over the ensuing 3 months. Like I said before, Lent is my least favorite time of year - though I admit this year wasn't too too bad - so that always makes those 90 days just feel like they are going to be so difficult to get through. Over these many weeks, we have seen the changing of both liturgical seasons as well as literal seasons - it was snowy and frigid back in Lent, and now I'm sitting under the AC as it cools my stuffy room on an oppressively hot day! We went from timidly encountering the enemy of our human nature out there in the darkness of the desert to the heralding of The Gospel to every nation and soul! This whole arc, this whole story, this whole months long journey with our Lord from the desert to the cross to hell to the glories of the Resurrection and Ascension has taken us to today, Pentecost. The birthday of the Church!

Perhaps the most overlooked or forgotten about member of the trio we call The Trinity, the Holy Spirit is so essential to our life as Christians that it is sorta silly that we don't always call upon Him nor really know how to pray to Him. This is admittedly an area where I don't always consciously think about and bring intentionality to my prayer, here. And the full exposition on this topic requires a few more inches of room than the bulletin here offers. But, for simplicity sake, the Holy Spirit is not vying for or jealous of your prayer time. He is not sitting there, pouting, that you are talking to The Father or to Jesus Christ - or even Mary and the Saints. Actually, He's not jealous, but He is helping to facilitate that, inspire our hearts to do that, fanning the faith within us to want to run to prayer! You and I don't need to pick and choose members of The Trinity; you and I just need to simply allow the Spirit to take us to prayer, to take us to The Father and The Son, to Mary and the Saints...The Holy Spirit does the heavy lifting of working against our human nature and into being partakers of the divine nature! Much like how Christ did the heavy lifting for us in winning our Salvation on the Cross, so too does the Holy Spirit do the heavy lifting for us in the life of prayer and evangelization!

We as Christians are called to be docile to the Holy Spirit. On this Pentecost Sunday, the birthday of the Church, recommit yourself to being obedient, docile to the Spirit. Docility to the flesh leads to sin, docility to the Spirit leads to holiness and sanctification!

A note of July 4th. With that holiday falling on a Saturday this year- as well as the picnic at St Joe's - I am making the following weekend mass change for that weekend *only*: Saturday July 4th: 4pm Mass St Mary. Sunday July 5: 8am St Joe and 11am St Michael. This is a one time change for that weekend of July 4 / 5.

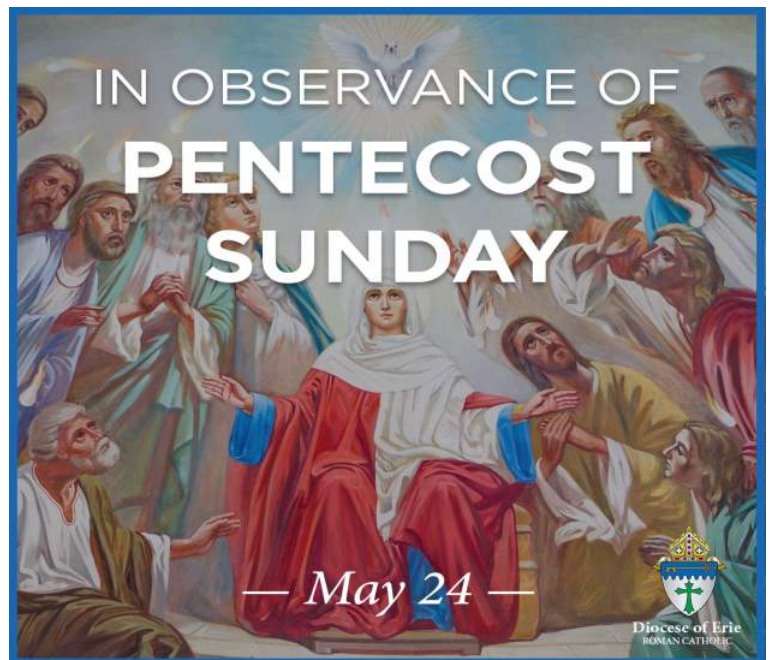
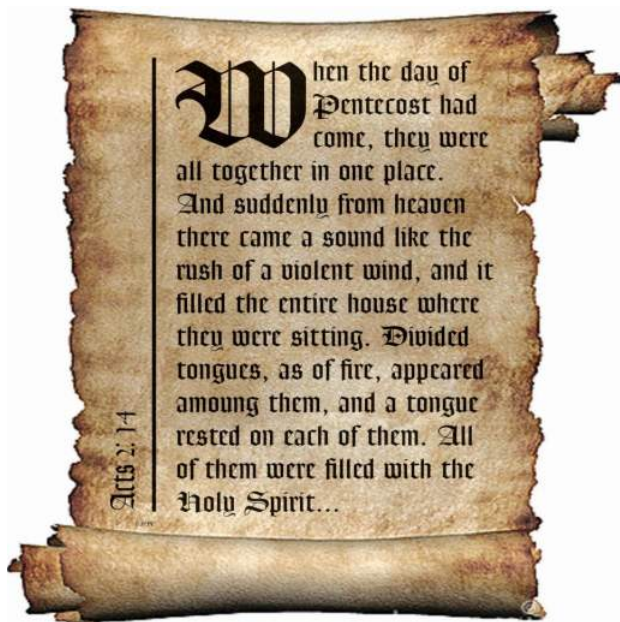
### St. Michael Rosary Society Updates!

June 28 – July 1, 2026 at St. Mark Seminary, Erie

‘Quo Vadis Days’ is a four-day vocation discernment camp for Catholic young men in high school (those finishing 8th grade to 2026 high school graduates) who are striving to follow God’s call in their lives and who are considering the priesthood or seminary formation or who are wondering if God is calling them to a religious vocation.

‘Quo Vadis Days’ is designed to help young Catholic men discern their vocation in life, particularly in relation to the priesthood. The name ‘Quo Vadis’ comes from a Latin phrase meaning ‘Where are you going?’, which is a reference to a story about Saint Peter. During these four days, the young men engage in a variety of activities including prayer, reflection, and discussions with priests and seminarians. These events provide a supportive environment for young men to explore their faith more deeply and consider how they might be called to serve God and the Church. They also offer a chance to form friendships with peers who are on a similar spiritual journey, fostering a sense of community and mutual encouragement. The deadline to register is June 22, 2026.

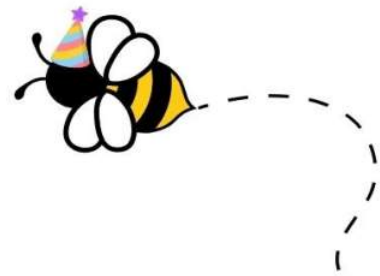
