## A Word from Father Brandon

We return this Sunday to regular Ordinary Time weekends. We have not had a 'Green Sunday' since Valentine's Day weekend! Now, we are Green every Sunday thru Thanksgiving (with the exception of All Saints which falls on a Sunday this year)! So buckle up as we re-engage the Ordinary Time Lectionary cycle. Through the summer, our First Readings follow no particular book: we will be in and out of about nine different Old Testament texts. The First Readings in the Sunday Lectionary do not follow a single book; they are always chosen to engage with the Gospel. In nerd language, that is called *Typology*: the old pointing to the new, or the new prefigured in the old. Through the summer months, our Second Reading will be from the Letter to the Romans. Then in the Fall we will be in the Letter to the Philippians and then the Letter to the Thessalonians will take us to Advent. Our Gospel readings will be exclusively from Matthew's Gospel, from Chapter 9, on. In Romans, Paul is a master theologian. It is said that Saint Paul's Letter to the Romans was the first book of Christian Theology ever written. Saint Matthew's Gospel positions Christ as a *new* Moses -the great teacher of the ancient faith. We are in store for some great Scripture, and great teaching of the faith! That is what I love most about Ordinary Time - especially this second half of it after the Easter Season: we are invited to enter into the mystery of so much of our faith and to go down rabbit holes and explore ideas that only pop up occasionally. As a homilist, I love the weekly opportunity to pray about and study up on different ideas and teachings of Christ - and to accept that weekly challenge of trying to say something sensible and coherent about it! I invite you into these next many weeks with a hunger for the totality of the faith! We are made for this faith - our hearts are restless until they rest in God and the faith God has handed on to us through the lips and lives of the Apostles, Martyrs, and Saints of every age!

That is the Sunday plan till Advent! Our weekdays will walk through a myriad of books for the First Reading: everything from 1 & 2 Kings to Revelation! The First Readings of the weekday Lectionary really is a buffet! Our Gospels will be reading the majority of the Gospel of Matthew from chapter 5, on, for the summer. Then, in the Fall, we move to Saint Luke's Gospel, where we read the majority of that, from chapter 4, on. All of this is to say that the Liturgy is so important for so many reasons, and not the least being that we are saturated in the Word of God! The Scriptures *were* and *are* liturgical texts! They were not compiled for any other purpose than to be used in sacred liturgy for the worship of God! Not as proof texts, not a debate fodder, not as a cudgel to win you over to my side of an argument...these texts were revered, memorized, word by word, by ancient Christians because they were so beautiful! They were so life giving! Because, they are what our souls were made for! I just encourage you and invite you make that effort to bring Scripture into your daily life, and I would say the best way is through the Liturgy - their home and privileged place. I invite you to get to daily Mass as often as possible. Even just once a month - it's faith changing! And, if you can't come, read the daily readings! There are so many ways to read them: missals, apps, monthly publications, etc. Just pray with them if you aren't! There is no better medicine for the soul and propellant to conversion and deepening of faith!
