

A Word from Father Brandon

I came across today (when I am writing this, Tuesday May 5) that 26 years ago this day was memorable - not for some global affair nor an event of magnitude that still ripples through our politics and economics to this day...no, nothing like that. 26 years ago was the series finale of the epitome of 90s television: *Boy Meets World*! Yes! May 5, 2000 was the final episode that every 90s kid and 90s mom and dad most definitely watched - at least somewhat! I would think it's hard to find more than a handful of people who watched TV in the 90's who wouldn't remember TGIF on ABC every Friday night! Who did not watch *Full House*, *Family Matters*, *Step By Step*...*Dinosaurs*?! Now, we're all in our silos on our apps, Roku and Fire Sticks doing our own thing...but, back then, TV was cultural and something you did with your family - it wasn't as indulgent and you rarely wasted the day stuck in front of a screen like you can so easily now. I'm kind of an evangelist of the 90s! If it were possible to go back and relive that decade over and over again, like Bill Murray's *Groundhog Day* character, I'd be first in line! Ok... I'll end the homily on the 90s!

Anyway, if you recall - or if you don't or have never seen it - the final scene of that finale of *Boy Meets World* is probably one of the most moving scenes of that TGIF era. If you don't know the show, simply: It follows the main character, Cory Matthews, his family and friends as they grow up from adolescence to adulthood. It also follows the character of Mr Feeny, the beloved teacher of Cory and his friends - who also happens to be the neighbor of the Matthews family. The show kept Mr. Feeny as the kids' teacher from 6th grade through college. He kept moving up and along with them. The show spanned seven seasons, so a lot of life happens for the characters. There are a lot of great lessons and meaningful takeaways throughout the series.

The final scene of that episode takes place as the 4 main characters are ready to move away and begin a new life, and the setting is in the middle school classroom where all their relationships began. In that last scene, Cory, Eric, Shawn, and Tapanga tell Mr Feeny, in their own way, they love him, and only after they leave, does Feeny, for the first time, to an empty room, tell them that he loves them. If you know the show, you know the heaviness of that scene - for those who don't, you're thinking, 'what is wrong with our pastor'!? I say all this, because, years removed from that night watching TGIF in May of 2000, I see a meaning in that which 14 year old Brandon could not see: In that classroom, with those people, with Feeny...the kids were safe; they were surrounded by familiarity, friendship, and love. They had been through a lot, yet had each other and the love they had for each other. The sad, yet joyful, thing about that storyline was that they each had to come to realize they needed to leave that familiarity, to leave what was, and go where they were being led - and realize that that would not sacrifice their love for each other. Granted, it's not a 'religious' show, but it certainly preaches the Gospel in a way that millions who grew up on that show remember to this day!

In reading the Acts of the Apostles throughout the Easter Season, there is this movement that we observe. There is a safe familiarity for the Apostles early on: their friendships, probably Mary; but also Jerusalem, and for Paul, it was Antioch which he fell in love with. But, slowly, and yet with the speed of the Spirit, Jerusalem and Antioch lose that status...the Apostles and Paul are no longer anchoring themselves into where they love, but more and more into whom they love! They come to see that the ultimate Love they sought, and found safety within, remained with them, because Our Resurrected and Ascended Lord remained with them, through The Spirit! As they gradually realized this, they became more bold and free, and went to greater lengths and greater distances to bring The Good News - together!

As Cory Matthews leaves, in that final scene, he is alone with Mr. Feeny, and he asks Feeny to come with him, but Feeny predictably says he will stay there. Then Cory tells him, '*you will always be with us, as long as we live*'. That is what the Apostles and the early Church figured out - The Lord is with them, not in a place, but in their hearts and in The Church! May we, too, find that courage to leave what is familiar and yet doesn't draw us to Christ or to souls in need of Christ. That is our constant duty as Christians: to remain with Christ as He remains with us, and to follow Him where He leads.

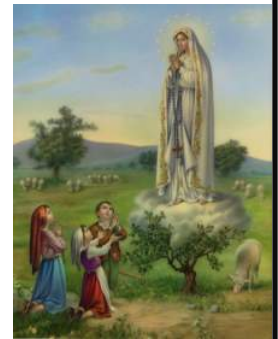
