A Word from Father Brandon

On the previous page, you will see the 2025 - 2026 Fiscal Year snapshot. With the FY having ended on 30 June, this is a full year's picture of **operating income** and **operating expenses**. This snapshot does not account for cash that was already in each checking account on 1 July, 2025; any savings and investments; nor designated funds like St Vincent de Paul, Walking with Moms, second collections, etc. You are **very** generous! **Thank You!** Some notes:

St. Mary. St. Mary has the unique obligation of housing Fr John and myself! So they naturally have more expenses like rectory upkeep and their utility bills are probably higher than they would otherwise be. They also maintain St Ann's. Their expenses are just unique. But if you take out some one-time expenses this past year that were big - bathroom and shower repair in the rectory (~\$9k) and new AEDs (~\$3k) - you account for half the 'deficit'.

St. Joseph. St. Joseph's this year made a \$100k subsidy to the School. The parish hadn't made a subsidy to the school for a few years, so there was cash piled up in checking that, though this looks large relative to income, it was not, relative to checking account balance. Going forward, the parish needs to make annual subsidies to the school. What that number is really comes down to what we need to pay the bills. We will need to just watch that over the coming months and make a determination in the Spring.

St. Michael. If you extract the income and expenses for the paving project they did at the beginning of this fiscal year, they have a very clean, predictable, balanced budget. Honestly, there isn't a whole lot that needs to be noted with them from this snapshot.

Envelopes. Beginning later this summer, you will start to receive two new envelopes: **The Holy Family Fund** and **Cemetery**. After the counsel and consent of three Parish Finances Councils, we are merging our Saint Vincent de Paul accounts and Walking with Moms, and creating one Tri-Parish 'charity' fund named *The Holy Family Fund*. This new fund will be overseen by a board I will assemble and they will be tasked with using the money for the needs of families in our parishes and communities. We are honoring both the mission of Walking with Moms and St. Vincent de Paul. Secondly, I am also creating an envelope for each of our cemeteries. Our cemeteries need the cash flow! All 4 are not where they need to be to be self-sustaining. Your regular gifts to the cemeteries will ensure cash flow to pay bills and allow the existing assets to compound and grow into true perpetual care funds. I am ending the St Vincent de Paul and the Building and Grounds envelopes.

One more note: I want to thank those who ran The Fourth of July Celebration last weekend! I was in awe at the love you have for our school and the work you put into that event to see to it that our school can thrive (I consider our Catholic Schools the '8th sacrament' so I will do anything to fight for them)! I also want to thank the many who showed up early on the 4th to do an emergency cleanup from the storm the night before! I heard dozens showed up early and reassembled many booths that blew over and broke! The entire event was amazing, and you have an amazing love for our school here and I can't thank you enough for being coworkers in the vineyard laboring for our school, our children, and our community!

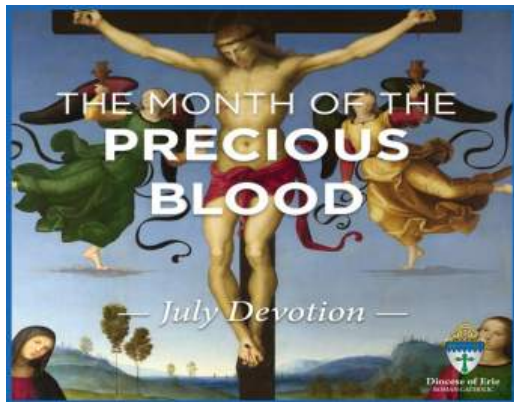

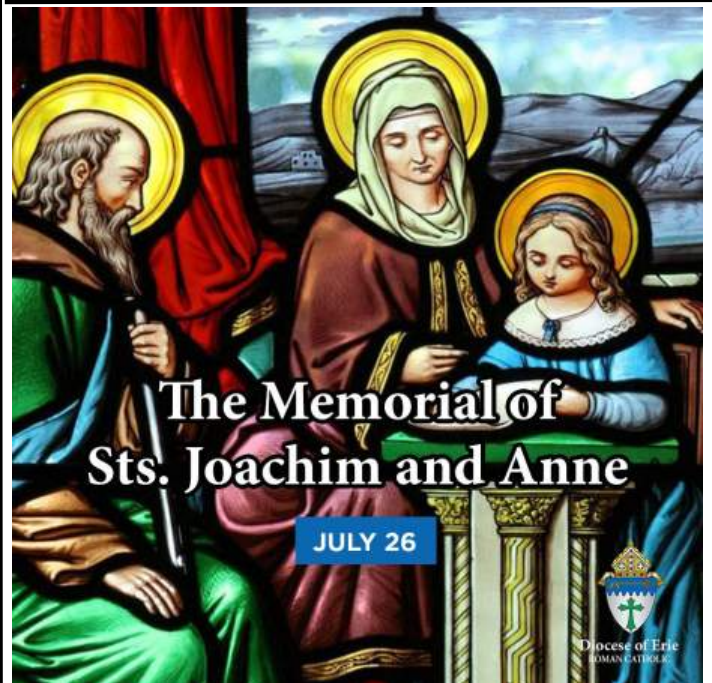
