A Word from Father Brandon

This past week was the Feast of Saint Patrick, a day of green eggs and beer for breakfast (if you indulged, congrats!) but it was also the Feast Day of our Diocese, for Patrick is our patron and advocate before God, storming heaven with his prayers and love for us and the ministry we do here! It's really cool to think that the Patrick of the Fifth Century and center of so much lore and admiration, from his perch, in the throne room of Heaven - sitting at the feet of Our Heavenly Father - he is aware of, sees, loves, and sustains the ministries we do here in the Erie Diocese! Patrick knows about Crown, Fryburg, and Lucinda! Patrick knows Fr Cory is off to nine new towns to minister, that Fr John has come here to assist us in the work of the Gospel and to bring new life and vibrancy to our nook in the diocese! That same Patrick who has inspired centuries of missionaries - and many toasts over a pint of beer - is our patron and implores The Father to give us every good thing that we need for the work of the Gospel here in our parishes, and then throughout! The same could be said of each individual patron: Mary, Joseph, Michael - these three parish patrons know us, see us, love us, cheer us on, and implore The Trinity to assist us with every good grace and blessing!

What makes Patrick - and truly any saint of the Church - remarkable and admirable allies in the work of Salvation that we participate in here on earth, is that he possesses a childlike - almost other worldly- optimism that all will be well; that God will do what He simply says He's going to do! For innumerable lay faithful over the centuries of the Church, that optimism has taken them to continents and corner stores with the message of the Gospel; that optimism has taken them to encounters and intimacies with God that they never knew possible; that childlike - divine optimism has brought them the vision to see new paths of possibilities of how the Gospel can be preached and heard, lived and received! Simply, if you and I just seek Jesus, He will be found! If we hunger for Jesus, we will be fed! If we thirst for Jesus, we will be satisfied! Period!

We say farewell to Fr Cory this weekend as he moves out to Houtzdale to be a Christ-like priestly presence among the peoples of 9 communities in Clearfield County. We begin here a new chapter of Fr John and I shepherding you and trying to be Christ-like and holy priests for you. Wherever the priesthood takes Fr Cory, Fr John, or me; however, the Lord is calling us to be attentive to Him at this time right now in our parishes and diocese, we need to simply seek Christ and He will provide. I am excited for Fr Cory as he takes on this new assignment - he will love it out there! I am also excited for Fr John and me as we embark on a new phase of ministering here and understanding what it means to be a family of parishes! We move forward; we don't resist and look back! I am excited to collaborate with Fr John and all of you as we seek Jesus and let Him show us our paths forward. May we embrace the optimism of the Saints who sit at the feet of the Father cheering for us and never lose that childlike faith!

Pius' Parting Ponderings...

To begin, I thank Fr. Brandon for the opportunity to write this message to my parish and school family. His only request was that he got to choose an alliterative title...I happily agreed! Too many thanks are in order to do them each justice here, so thank you all for your love, your generous hearts, your patience, your prayers, and your trust.

I'd like to share the very beginning of my path to the priesthood. I was taking a theology class during my junior year in college, and we had to read a book for an assignment. I chose *Pilgrim to the Russian Church: An American Journalist Encounters a Vibrant Religious Faith in the Soviet Union* by Jim Forest. The author documents the revival of the Russian Orthodox Church in the late 1980s as the USSR began to remove restrictions on religious practice. The story he recounts is one that shows the power of Jesus Christ working in the hearts of real people. God's love, mercy, and truth were present even there – especially there. Christian community began to grow into public life, and the Church was visible. Dozens of children were baptized at a time, Christian marriages were returning, churches were full, priests were a part of the lives of families, and Jesus Christ was proclaimed in a place that had been in terrible darkness for many years.

I found myself having an unexpected reaction to the book – I pictured myself doing what the priests were doing, and thinking that I would be happy doing that! To make a long story short, the Lord wouldn't let me run from that thought forever. Many years of prayer, discernment, and conversion of my heart led me to lay on the marble floor of St. Peter Cathedral and say "yes" to God's call to be a priest of Jesus Christ. And then I came here on July 11, 2023.

As my first full-time pastoral assignment comes to an end, I've been trying to reflect on it all in a short period of time. This is my conclusion: I have had the blessing of experiencing all of that with you! What Mr. Forest witnessed in Russia can happen and is happening here in Clarion and Forest counties! And I'm at peace knowing that I gave Him, and you, my best.

Friends, each of us is called to be a saint who loves Jesus with all our heart. Stay close to Him, the Holy Catholic Church, each other, the Sacraments, all of it. There is no other Way. Because we must never abandon the Holy Eucharist! Not over a priest. Not over a building. Not over a Mass time. Not over an opinion. Not over something that was or wasn't said. Not over a teaching that we struggle to accept. If we do, it was all in vain.

Please know of my love and gratitude for each of you.

We'll see each other in the Eucharist.

STAINGLASS WINDOWS

Stain glass windows are not only beautiful in our churches but carry a lot of symbolic meanings and messages.

The symbolism of colors and the stories depicted help people to understand and deepen their faith. Common colors and their meaning are:

Red: Represents the blood of Christ, love, and sacrifice. Blue symbolizes heaven, hope, and divine wisdom; frequently associated with the Virgin Mary. Green represents growth, renewal, and life. Violet signifies royalty, truth, and love. White represents purity, innocence, and chastity. Yellow/Gold symbolizes divinity, glory, and the light of God. Black is used sparingly; it can signify mourning and death.

40 Cans for 40 Days Program

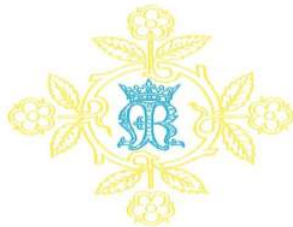

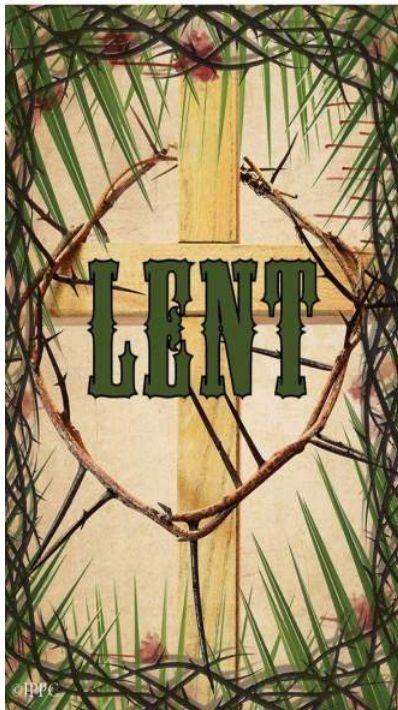

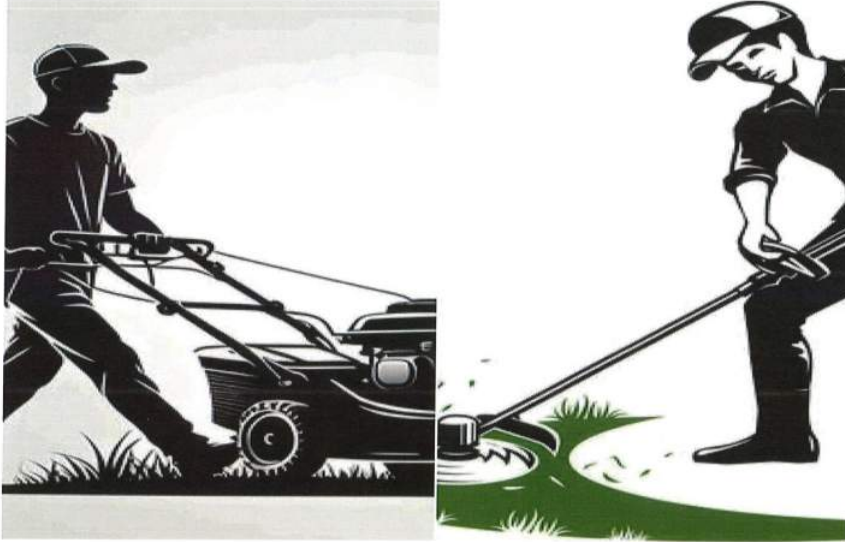
