

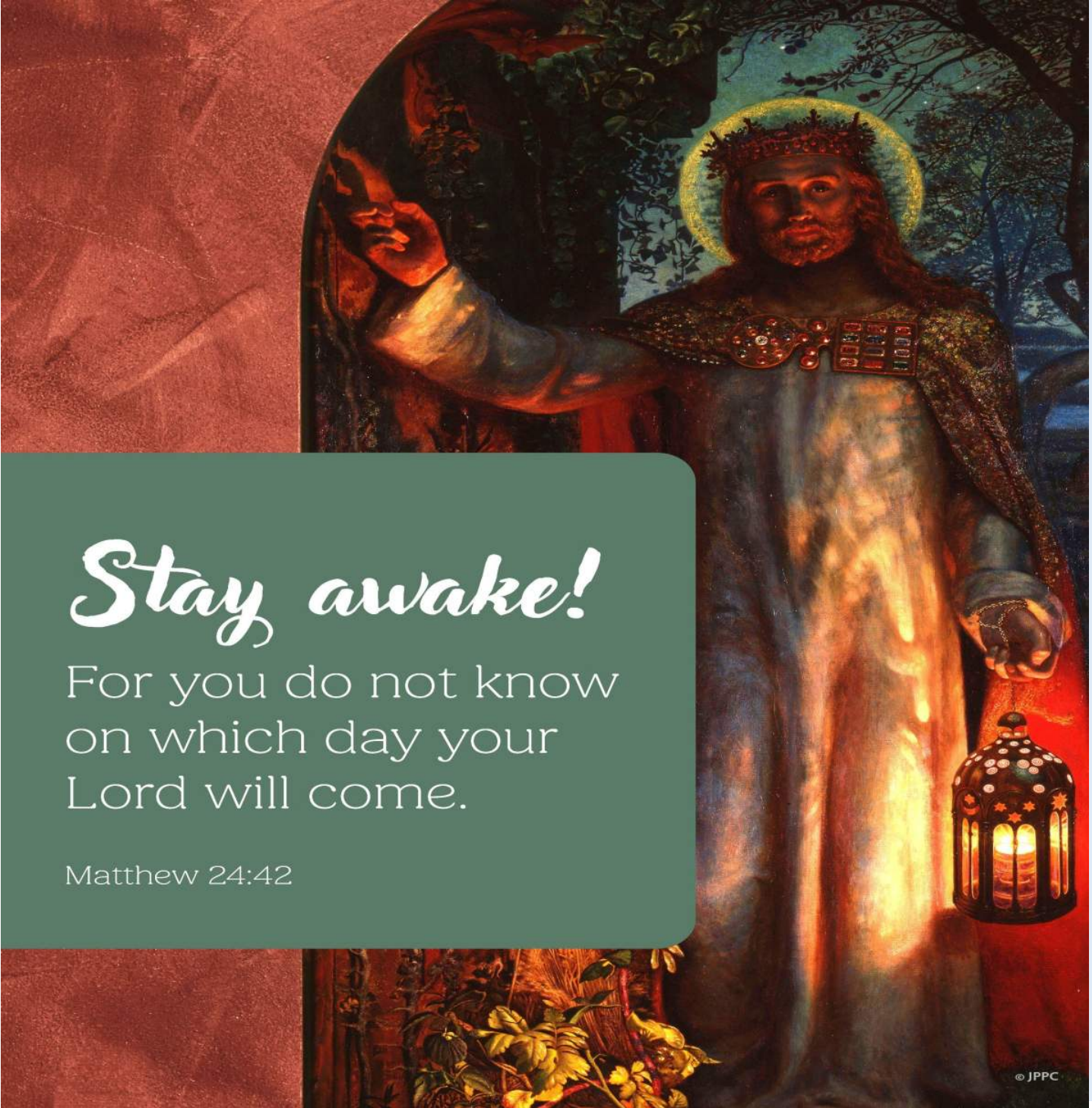

A Word from Father Brandon

Happy New (Liturgical) Year! Coming to the beginnings of another trip around the sun, moving from the anticipation of the coming of the Messiah through the burgeoning and unstoppable proclamation of His Gospel in the life of the Church, is always an exciting time! Yes, we are now in the midst of the holiday season, but we are also beginning a new journey of exploring the fullness of the mysteries of our faith. The busyness and merriment of this time set aside for a second: we are always, all of us, in need of a new beginning and a fresh start in our life of faith and of pursuit of the fullness of intimate love with the Holy Trinity. In these days of the Advent Season — in the stillness of the desert with The Baptist — allow the dark chill of these days to lead you to seek the warmth and comfort of the faith, of Christ, and of The Father. Perhaps this Season of Advent can be one where we reawaken our awareness of our own longings and expectations - just as the Baptist, the prophets, and the nations were similarly longing for a Messiah in their day. Where are you longing for peace? Where are you longing for healing? Where are you hungering for the feasts of faith and not the dreads of doubt? Where am I thirsting for the quench of love that the world cannot give? Where am I pining for something new and that fulfills? These are the types of questions — and many more — to take with you into the icy stillness of the Season, into the deafening silence of the desert. That is the beauty and the richness of this holy Season.

As we enter into the Advent Season this weekend, let us take note to carve out a few moments over these few weeks to get to the Sacrament of Confession. Those times have been, and are published, in the bulletin. Fr. Cory and I tried to sprinkle them throughout the days of Advent, diversifying the days and times so that the net is cast as wide as possible. As of this writing, there are no ‘penance services’ scheduled, that I know of, in the Deanery. With Fr. Mike’s departure, he also left as Dean of the Deanery, so there has not been coordinated Deanery planning for a few months. To my surprise, I was elected the new Dean of the Deanery only a few weeks ago...not something else I was looking to take on, but I accepted it with trust that I would be able to stay on top of it. Since I was only tapped for the role a few weeks back, penance services just have not gotten to the top of my schedule, so for this year’s Advent, it really is up to the pastors to plan them themselves if they want them. If any are scheduled, I will pass that info along. But, for now, take note of our extra times, at all the parishes, and find a few moments to receive the grace of Mercy this time of year.

Why Confession during Advent? Why does the Church associate Confession with this Season? Well, to connect it with this time of year honors the unique character of this Season. Again, we are like the Baptist, out in the chilly night of the desert, longing and looking for the Messiah! Our souls are pining to be saved, rescued, seen, heard, and loved! As we begin a new year, and reorient ourselves with the desires of God and our hearts — and not of the loud and fallen world — Confession affords our souls and hearts to be reminded of what we live for and what God is longing for with us — not just us towards God, but indeed God towards us. He, too, longs, pines, thirsts for intimate union with us — more so than us for Him! Allow the Sacrament of Confession to not only be an admission of guilt, but rather, more profoundly, a declaration of what you want, of what your soul was made for, and a reminder of the Trinity's pining for union with *you!*

Beginning the Church liturgical year, Advent (from, “ad-venire” in Latin or “to come to”) is the season encompassing the four Sundays (and weekdays) leading up to the celebration of Christmas. The Advent season is a time of preparation that directs our hearts and minds to Christ’s second coming at the end of time. Advent is not about speculation. Our Advent readings call us to be alert and ready, not weighted down and distracted by the cares of this world (Lk 21:34-36). Like Lent, the liturgical color for Advent is purple. Three of the Advent wreath candles are purple representing Jesus’s royalty and also penance, preparation, sacrifice and prayer. The fourth candle on the Advent wreath (for the third Sunday in Advent), represents joy and light.

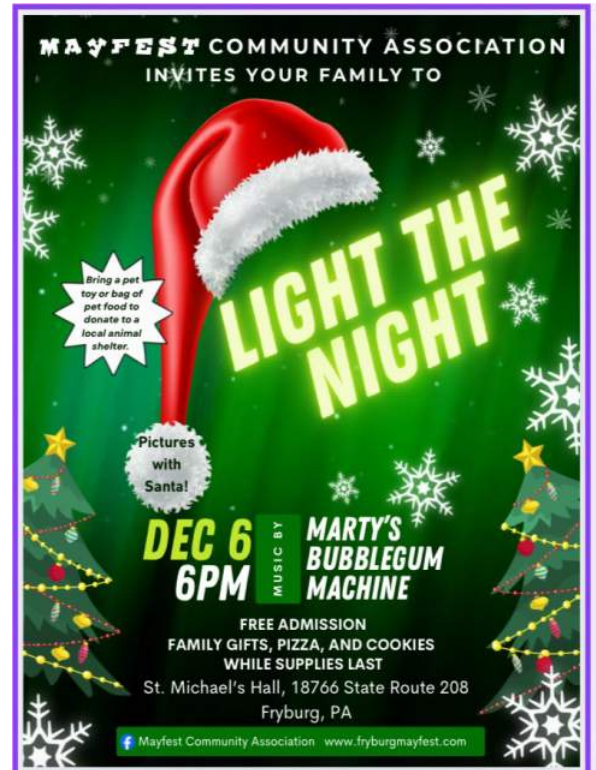

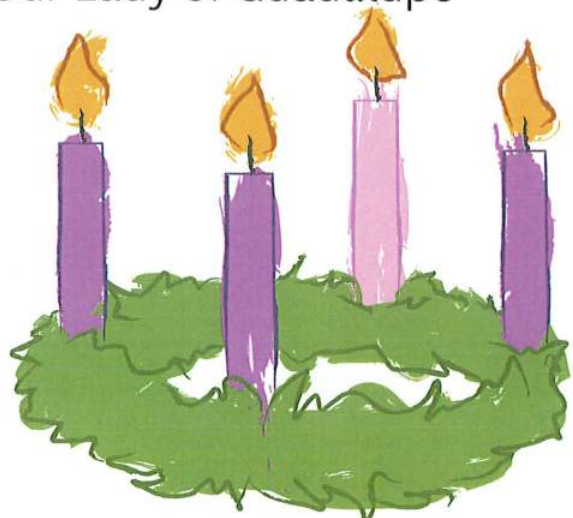

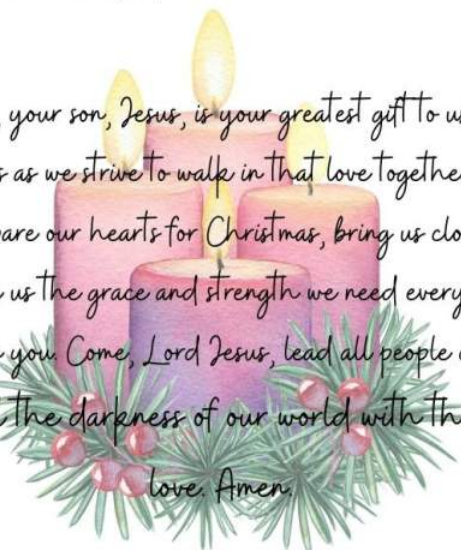

Preschool

Preschool will be learning all about stories in December. From the true story of Jesus's birth to the make believe story of How the Grinch Stole Christmas, we will be identifying characters and settings, sequencing events, and comparing and contrasting. We continue to practice our letter and number recognition. We wish everyone a very Merry Christmas!



1st Grade

First grade's Religion lessons will be -Advent, Immaculate Conception, Our Lady of Guadalupe, Christmas, and The Saints, and how they set great examples as followers of Jesus. In reading, our stories will be - The Big Race and Animal Groups. Our reading skills will cover the short vowels, consonants, digraph kn, wr, gn, mb, endings -ine, ite, adverbs, verbs, and skills on Exact Path Reading. In math, we will add and subtract to 20 measure length and we will continue mastering skills on Exact Path Math.



3rd Grade

In third grade, we are writing opinion pieces in language arts. In math, we are learning how to multiply and divide. In Religion, we are learning about how the Holy Spirit helps us to pray prayers of petition, intercession, blessing, praise, and thanksgiving. We are learning about what makes up weather in science, and lastly In social studies, we are learning about different cultures.



Preschool

Preschool has been having a lot of fun with colors, shapes, the alphabet, and counting. As Christmas nears, we will be talking about the birth of Jesus and fun holiday traditions. We will continue to learn new letters and review the numbers zero through ten. We wish our families and friends a blessed Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year!



2nd Grade

In second grade, we will begin our multiplication and division chapter in math. We will learn how to multiply using repeated addition and equal groups. We will divide using repeated subtraction. In social studies, we will be learning about different types of landforms. I wish you and your family a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year!



4th Grade

In robotics, we are programming our robots to use two bump sensors and a distance sensor to complete different challenges. In math, we have begun our geometry unit, where students are learning about the characteristics of lines, angles, and various shapes. In writing, we are starting our informational writing unit, where students will learn how to research and organize facts to teach others about a topic of interest.



6th Grade

In health, the students are learning about the special dietary needs of teens. The class is also discussing ways to prevent foodborne illness, the causes of food allergies and intolerances. Our language arts lessons involve identifying a metaphor as a figure of speech that compares two things that are very different; the sun was a jewel shining in the sky. Included will be the identification of transitive and intransitive verbs and using them correctly in our writing.



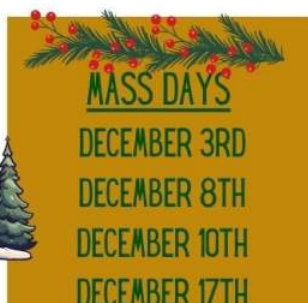
Kindergarten

Kindergarten's lessons in Religion will be -Advent, Christmas, and stories of the Saints. In reading, our stories will be -Turtle Splash and What a Beautiful Sky. Our reading skills will cover blending letter sounds, nouns, verbs, sequence, and exploring skills on Exact Path Reading. In math, we will be naming our shapes and counting to 100 and exploring Exact Path Math.



5th Grade

In Religion, fifth grade is learning that the Holy Spirit is the Advocate promised by God. In social studies, we are exploring the course and consequences of the American Revolution. In language arts, we are building an understanding of characters in a story, studying the use of dialect, and examining the author's word choice in the story Old Yeller.
